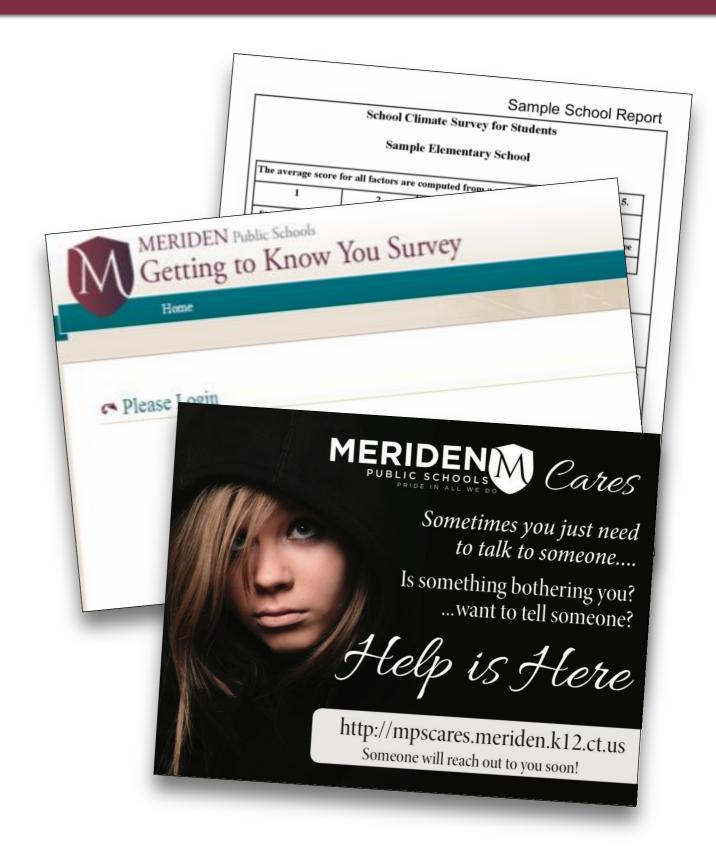

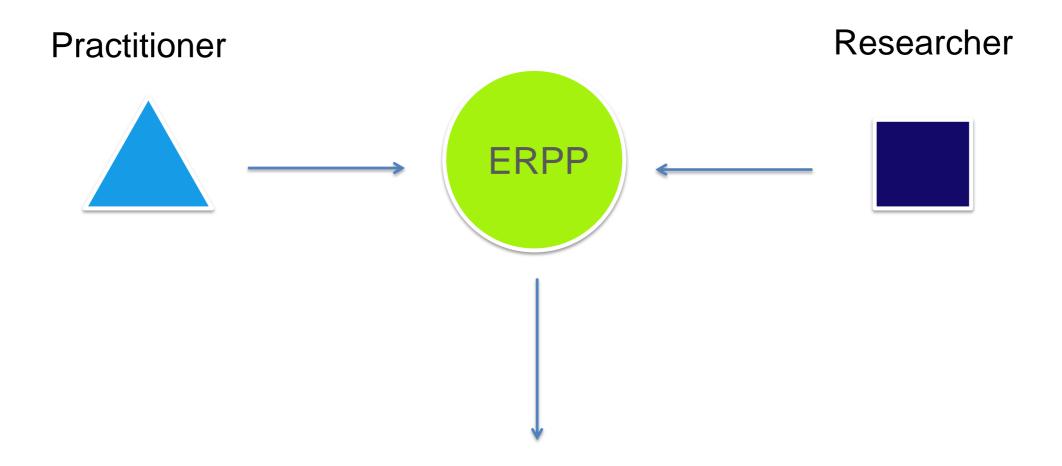


Value of Research-Practice Partnerships in Education



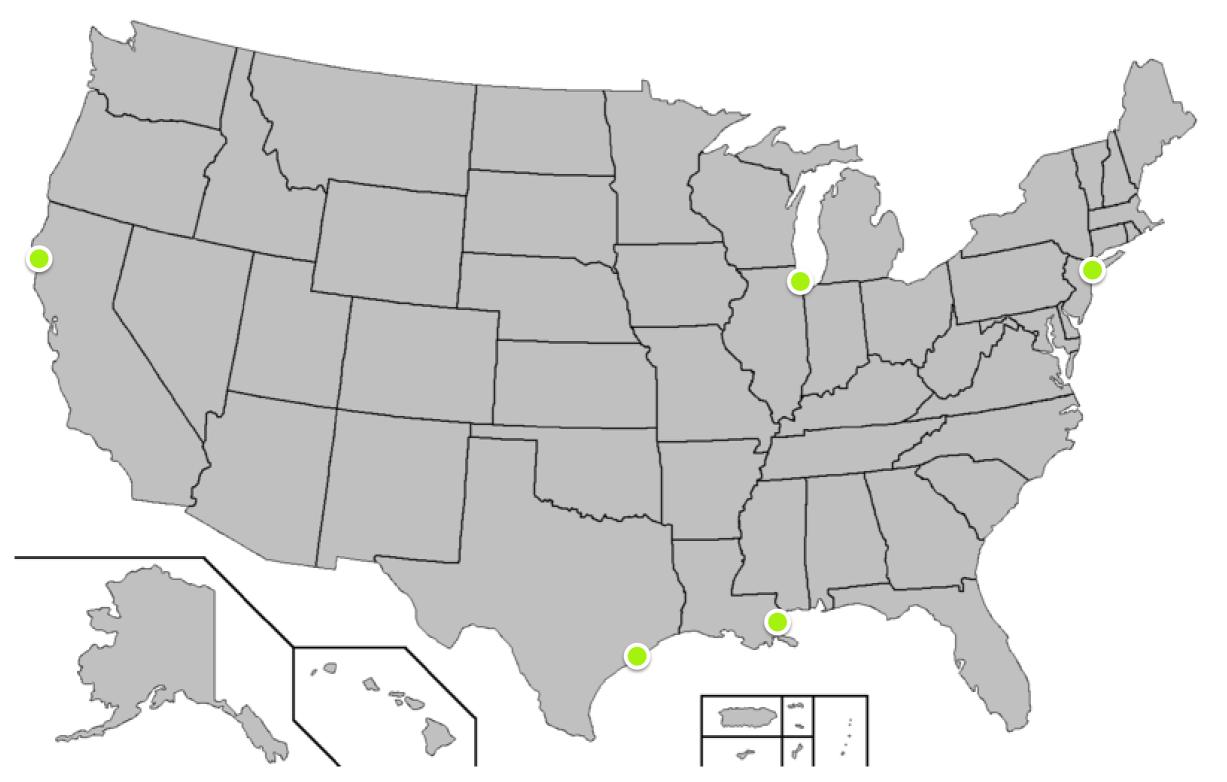

Collaboration is Hard

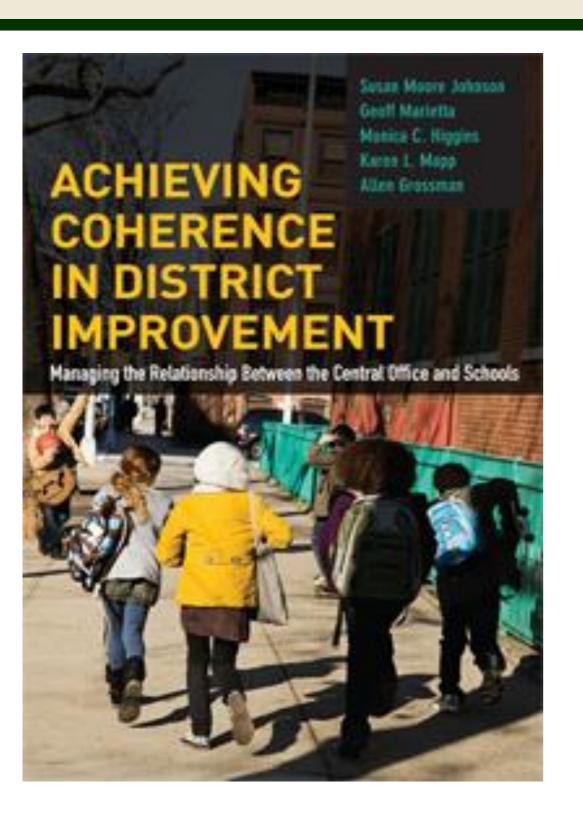
Different organizational goals, culture, procedures, and language create barriers to SUCCESS (Huxham & Vangen, 2001).



People favor the groups to which they belong and discriminate against outsiders – even when randomly assigned (Tajfel, 1981; Smith & Henry, 1996).

Member favoritism and misunderstanding of out-group members increases conflict, and inhibits collaboration

Collaboration in School Districts



Large complex systems, expected to play a special role to ensure racial, social, and economic equity (Kincheloe, 2010)

Reforms intended to "raise the bar and close the gap" often implemented at the intersection of central office and schools.

Tensions between priorities of administrators in the central office and those in the schools (Steinberg, 2014; Johnson & Chrispeels, 2010)

- In order for student learning to improve, adult behaviors must become more collaborative and student-focused (Futernick, 2016; Anrig, 2013; Rubinstein & McCarthy, 2013; Erbstein & Miller, 2008).
- Effectiveness of any reform is inextricably tied to the ability of adults from different organizations to work together
- While there is a growing research and resources on how to work together more effectively, educators often have a hard time finding the relevant and accessible support.

- Offers practical guidance on how to systematically affect change using collaboration.





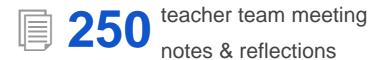
