








Dashboards


Teacher's Directions to View Student's Responses



















IMPROVED STUDENT PERCEPTIONS OF A POSITIVE SCHOOL CLIMATE



- 10% increase in Teacher's Perceptions of a "positive school climate."
- 9% increase in Teachers' Perceptions that "staff is supported by administration".
- 12% increase in Teachers' Perceptions that "administration treats all staff with respect".


STAR Reading Results
